PREFACE

This is the third edition, with additions and amendments (and a renumbering), of the edition originally published in 2004 by White Sheep Press. The intention of this checklist is to list all of the writings published by Abercrombie (although there are almost certainly a large number of book reviews and articles for the *Nation* that have not been traced). However, without this essential building block, which puts his works into context, meaningful analysis and criticism of his work is difficult.

This is a working document, and if you would like to help make it a definitive list, please send any amendments and additions to me at jeff@jeffcooper.me.uk. They will be incorporated in the list and acknowledged.

The format of the checklist is chronological, in order of first publication in periodical and book form. It should be borne in mind that there is a bibliographical hierarchy: contributions to periodicals, then contributions to books, and finally principal books. Therefore, if a poem is published in a book before publication in a periodical, the periodical is not listed separately, whereas if it is published in a periodical before publication as a contribution to a book, then in a principal book, it will be listed separately on each occasion (therefore no selections of works already published in book form are listed).

Principal books are depicted in bold italic capitals, contributions to books are in bold italic upper-lower case letters, and periodical titles are in italics. All the text may be searched using Ctrl + F.

I should like to record my acknowledgements to an enormous number of people, as I have been working on this list for many years, but it would be invidious to pick out individuals, except the late Mrs. Catherine Abercrombie, who started me off, and her son Ralph (also no longer with us) whose knowledge of this subject was inspirational.
