Nick Denton has been an enthusiast for Edward Thomas since schooldays. Since his retirement he has been trying to identify locations that inspired Thomas poems, walking in his footsteps all over the South Country and Wales. Over the last four years he has also been transcribing his field notebooks, held in the Berg Collection in New York, which provide insights into the origins of many of his poems. He posts monthly the results of his research about individual poems on the website www.edwardthomaspoetryplaces.com.

Elizabeth Black is a writer, researcher and lecturer with an interest in ecocriticism, nature writing and literary modernism. Her first book - The Nature of Modernism: Ecocritical Approaches to the Poetry of Edward Thomas, T. S. Eliot, Edith Sitwell and Charlotte Mew (Routledge, 2017) - explores many of these themes. She has subsequently published several articles with a focus on Edward Thomas, exploring aspects of his writing including his ecocentric war poetry, connections between nature and mental health, and the shifting meaning of 'home' in his work.
