**Meeting of the North Western Group** of the FDP (and their friends) held on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2024 at Potters Barn, Church Street, Ribchester, Preston PR3 3YE. Report from Valerie Haworth

After a lovely lunch, we settled down with former Poet Laureate John Masefield whose father was a solicitor – the family name continues in that profession – but JM formed the desire to be a sailor. He underwent training on HMS Conway, off Anglesey, and suffered badly with sea-sickness but from that inauspicious beginning came an output of maritime verse, including the collection 'Salt Water Ballads' one of which, of course, was 'Cargoes', which a generation of schoolchildren were forced to learn by heart.

The 'master of verbal music' was much in evidence here and in 'Sea Fever'. In contrast Roger read 'Port of Holy Peter', which has much grim imagery, and then 'On Eastnor Knoll' a rural area not far from Ledbury (which is a long way from the sea).

From the huge output we noted many sonnets, a number dealing with the downfall of society and the desolation of once-glorious cities. Roger read 'Is there a Great Green Commonwealth of Thought?' and Valerie picked the sombre one beginning 'Like bones the ruins of cities stand', from the collection 'Enslaved'.

Our next meeting is scheduled for noon on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> March – again at the Potters Barn - when the topics will be Walter de la Mare and Edmund Blunden.
